

It's the kind of story that breaks your heart into a thousand shards and then mends it in the same sitting—laced with grace and wrapped up in gratitude. If you haven't heard it for yourself, come over and let's sit awhile. We'll put the kettle on.

Saving Grace has been home to over 150 young women in the last 12 years, empowering them to break the brutal cycle of poverty that has so greatly influenced their lives—to God be the glory for the great things He has done! But friends, we know he is calling us to do even more.

Our program receives over 150 applications a year, but we can only serve 12 girls at a time in our current space. There is a great need for our ministry to expand to serve even more vulnerable young women in our community and beyond.

In the past year, God has cast His vision and given us a very exciting opportunity to grow. Will you lean in for a moment as we share it openly for the first time?

we bought a farm! Saving Grace is growing to serve even MORE vulnerable

young women in our community with a farm-style campus in Centerton, Arkansas, built to serve 50 girls at a time!

There is something sacred about experiencing life on a farm. From cultivating the ground to grow a garden to attending equine therapy on property and learning responsibilities by helping with farm chores, these experiences will enable "Grace" to heal from past trauma and begin to grow in new ways.

We are excited as we envision the potential community impact Grace Farms will make! Not only will "Grace" experience deep healing and be empowered to create a new future for herself, but upcoming generations will also be impacted for years to come.

Through your continued support, even more vulnerable young women will experience healing, encounter healthy relationships, and gain access to resources.

NWA RAISED THE ROOF

Last fall, more than 125 individuals, 16 companies, and 8 churches joined us at Grace Farms as we repaired the roof on Grace House—which freshmen and sophomores in the program will call their home. This repair was quoted at over \$100,000, but through the generosity of individuals and businesses giving of their time and resources, God provided more than we could ask or imagine. This project cost us only \$4,000.

COMMUNITY WORKDAY

60+ families and individuals joined us for our first Community Workday at Grace Farms in 2022! Tractors were loaned, work gloves put on, and this willing and kind-spirited bunch came ready to serve!

FARM-TO-FRESH EXPERIENCE

This spring, Happy Egg generously provided funds to build a chicken coop for "Grace!" In addition, our community SHOWED UP during our February, "Share the Love" campaign. Funds raised from "Share the Love" paired with a grant from the Arkansas Hunger Relief Alliance have opened opportunities to plant a garden this spring. "Grace" will now have a farm-to-fresh unique experience through raising chickens and vegetation, allowing "Grace" to understand and appreciate food sources and long-term sustainability.



MEET ALLY & KEL

Mentoring isn't one-sided—both parties can learn from one another and grow simply by sharing their hearts and showing up for each other.

Most people approach mentoring with trepidation, wondering if they have what it takes.

But, if you have love to give and time to share, you have precisely what it takes to mentor,

Kelly wasn't in the best place personally and wondered if she had anything to offer as she walked into the room to meet her mentee, Ally. Kelly could have faked a smile and pretended to be fine, but she chose risky vulnerability and shared her heartbreak with Ally. And from that broken place, God did something extraordinary in the hearts of both Kelly and Ally to connect them almost instantly.

As Kelly shared with Ally that she had just miscarried, Ally stepped into a

role that no one would think she was ready for as a mentee. Ally became a comforting, compassionate friend that would tend to Kelly's heart in ways she needed most. The following days and weeks, Ally would check on Kelly to let her know she was thinking of her and see if Kelly was okay.

That summer at Grace Camp, a group of mentors shared their birth stories and what it was like bringing life into the world. Kelly wanted to hear those stories, but as others shared, Ally consistently looked over and shared a smile with Kelly to make sure she was okay. Ally made sure that Kelly knew she wasn't alone. She had a mentee that had her back and cared about HER unfinished story.

As Kelly and Ally walked out of the chapel that day, Ally looked at Kelly and said, "Next year, I bet you will be sharing your birth story with everyone."

Ally had enough faith for both of them.

When we share our stories with others, we heal a little each time. Ally and Kelly

BEQUESTS

Have you experienced a recent life change (married, had kids, retired)? As you make changes to your will or trust, Saving Grace would be honored to be listed as a charitable bequest.

APPRECIATED STOCK

Do you own appreciated stock? It may be mutually beneficial to gift shares with gains, possibly avoiding capital gains on the gifted stock. Many investors in NWA own shares that have appreciated from a very low-cost basis. Due to the growth in the stock

market in the last few years, there are many companies locally and globally that have unrealized gains. Saving Grace has a brokerage account at Arvest Wealth Management and can receive in-kind shares as gifts.

TRADITIONAL/INHERITED RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

Do you own a traditional or inherited retirement account, are 72 or older, and the IRS requires a minimum distribution, also known as an "RMD"? You may be eligible to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution that could impact "Grace" for years to come. This not only satisfies the requirement of withdrawal but may avoid ordinary income.

LIFE INSURANCE

Do you own a cash value life insurance policy? Any cash value that accumulates can be accessed only during your lifetime. Would you consider naming Saving Grace as the beneficiary of your existing policy? By converting the name of the policy to Saving Grace, any cash value and premiums paid could be a charitable tax donation.
